I was glad to know that you and your family are safely settled in Cincinnati, and I earnestly hope that you will all keep well, and have a satisfactory winter; though I know that it cannot be a wholly happy one, on account of the unrest which is still existing in your beloved country, Mexico.

I have great hope that under President Wilson's sympathy and right International feeling, and by a better understanding which should come through the Mexican Commission now sitting in New London, that the United States will do its part properly, and give Mexico the the fullest opportunity to work out its own salvation, as it can surely do, if outsiders do not interfere.

I was greatly interested in what you told me you had been able to accomplish against the militarization of the Mexican Schools.

We are all well, and are expecting to move to Milton on October second.

Please present my compliments to Mrs. Chavez and her Mother, and I know Alice would join me in warm greetings to Miss Letitia. Alice and Malcolm are at present riding in the Woods.
